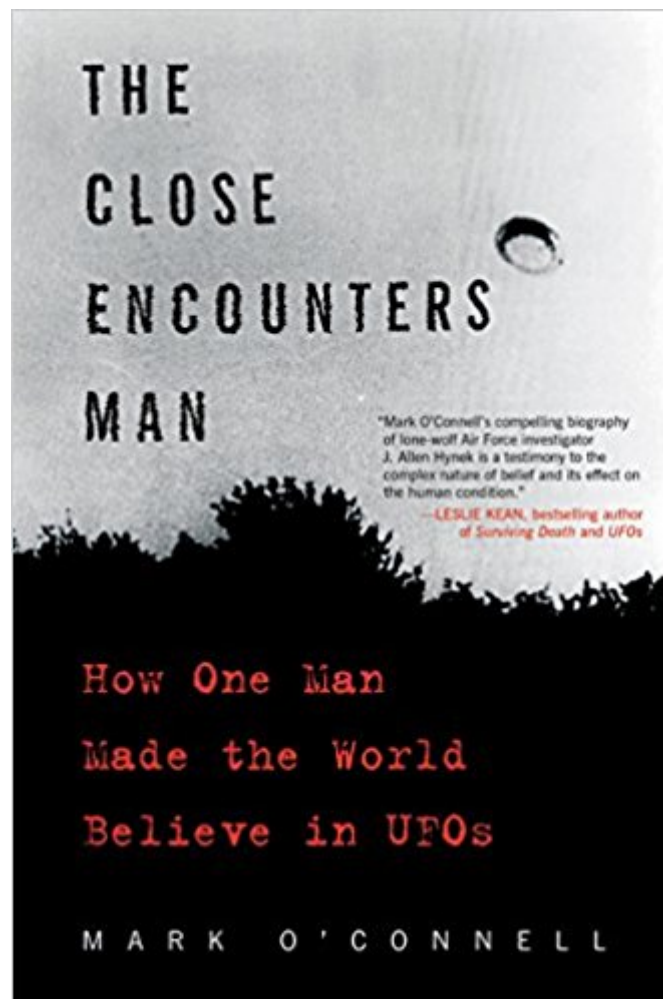




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The Close Encounters Man: How One Man Made The World Believe In UFOs



Synopsis

The wildly entertaining and eye-opening biography of J. Allen Hynek, the astronomer who invented the concept of "Close Encounters" with alien life, inspired Steven Spielberg's blockbuster classic science fiction epic film, and made a nation want to believe in UFOs. In June 1947, private pilot Kenneth Arnold looked out his cockpit window and saw a group of nine silvery crescents weaving between the peaks of the Cascade Mountains at an estimated 1,200 miles an hour. The media, the military, and the scientific community led by J. Allen Hynek, an astronomer hired by the Air Force, debunked this and many other Unidentified Flying Object sightings reported across the country. But after years of denials, Hynek made a shocking pronouncement: UFOs are real. Thirty years after his death, Hynek's agonizing transformation from skepticism to true believer remains one of the great misunderstood stories of science. In this definitive biography, Mark O'Connell reveals for the first time how Hynek's work both as a celebrated astronomer and as the U. S. Air Force's go-to UFO expert for nearly twenty years stretched the boundaries of modern science, laid the groundwork for acceptance of the possibility of UFOs, and was the basis of the hit film *Close Encounters of the Third Kind*. 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This is a well done biography. I'd recommend it to anyone who is interested in the historical side of the UFO problem or Hynek's life. It doesn't carry an ETH bias, which was appreciated, and does a great job of narrating bigger UFO events such as the Michigan Swamp Gas event, the Pascagoula, Mississippi incident, and several others that Hynek either directly investigated or of peripheral importance on the field of UFOs. Mark also covers some of the lesser known esoteric interests of Hynek, as well as his academic career and government-contracted work. This is a great text to read before getting into Hynek's actual literature and essays, or as solid background on the author if you've previously read Hynek's work.

Mr. O'Connell unravels the life and work of a mostly forgotten man who had an undeniable impact on science and American culture. *CLOSE ENCOUNTERS OF THE THIRD KIND*, and *THE X-FILES* owe Dr. Hynek a great debt, and if you're fan of either, so do you. O'Connell creates a 3D image of Hynek, and refuses to let us discount the contributions he made to astronomy, physics, and WWII. Like Hynek, O'Connell does not make leaps in logic or editorialize about UFOs. This is an honest look at a man who researched a ubiquitous phenomenon that remains unexplained and diminished to this day. It is a riveting biography, and deep look into a broad swath of American history. I cannot recommend it more highly.

I'd like to point out how well pulled together this book is and how entertaining to read -- as a biography, as a pop culture history, as a serious attempt to understand a time and place in the world. It really is a page-turner; the style just flows. I highly recommend it.
