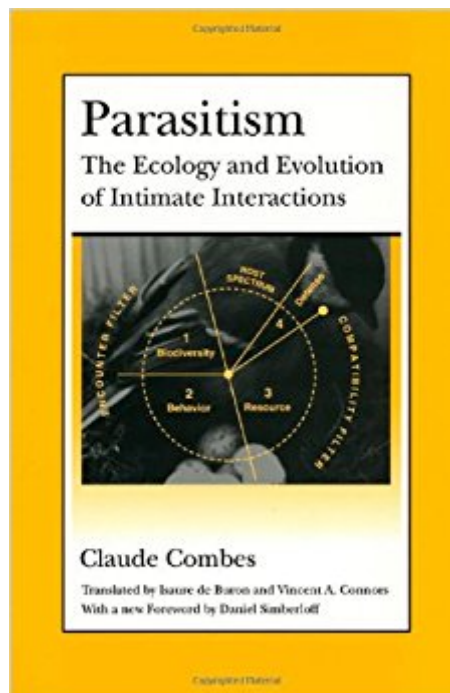




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Parasitism: The Ecology And Evolution Of Intimate Interactions (Interspecific Interactions)
