

This is a book-by-book narrative and quite well done. I read the Narnia Chronicles years ago and caught a few of the spiritual references but not all by far. C.S. Lewis was such a master of story telling, bringing in the meaning of scriptural passages: the dangers of pride, forgiveness, sacrifice, the worth of each individual. And you don't know ahead of time how he's going to work this in or where the story will lead. Well worth the price and time spent.

This is a great read alongside the classic series, Chronicles of Narnia. If you want to get some insight into Lewis' theology and how it's depicted in the Chronicles, this is a great book.

But not a lot. Read the books -not just the Narnia books but Mere Christianity and The Great Divorce. Jack is awesome.

Even though I am a "grown up," I have thoroughly enjoyed reading all of the Narnia books. I have seen the biblical stories in CS Lewis' writing. I will more than likely be reading these stories until I go to "Narnia."

I have not gotten to read it as yet. I would give it a 3 until I read it. When I read it, and if it is as good as the Narnia series I would give it a 10.

This book is an excellent guide to the spiritual themes in the Narnia Chronicles. It goes book by book with a lot of the information that came from C.S. Lewis himself. A lot of work and thought has gone into this. I highly recommend it for anyone interested in the Chronicles of Narnia.
