


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Song Of Blades And Heroes - Revised Edition

This is a great way to get into miniature gaming if you already have a collection of miniatures or you and a friend are playing with miniatures from different systems. The rules are clearly laid out and the game gives a lot of variety.

I've been playing RPGs and tabletop wargaming since the early 80's (MERP, Red Box D&D, Battlesystem Skirmishes, etc.) and can say hands down this is the best game system for fantasy wargaming. I recently got into the Hobbit SBG (my first foray into Games Workshop's products) and while those models were nice and the rules weren't bad, GW as a company seemed to really want to charge for any little thing they could. I also really didn't like the fact those rules were limiting when it came to using my own non-GW minis. I searched around for a generic, open ruleset and SBH came highly recommended. For under \$15 I figured I had nothing to lose. The rules are concise, fast, and very common-sense. The rulebook takes under an hour to read and is well organized. I like that it sets the framework for the game, but also makes it very easy to alter or add-on your own house rules. On top of that, the creator of the game runs a Yahoo! group to answer any questions. I've played numerous sessions with the rules already and absolutely love them.

My favorite light skirmish game rules. The push your luck activation system is very clean and offers good choice and enough planning to be engaging without over thinking it. Use any figure from your collection with a complete character and troop build system. Plenty of expansion material available, and an active Facebook community, great game system if you want to get away from closed "only buy our stuff" games.

Andrea Sfiligoi of Ganesha Games has resurrected Fantasy skirmish with the Song of Blades and Heroes game system. Games are easily completed in an hour. Typical force ratios are 8-12 miniatures per side. Simple and elegant, his rules allow any fantasy setting to be gamed and any figure to be used. The rules are quickly learned yet nuanced enough to provide long hours of play. The appendix contains many, many monsters and archetypical characters from various fantasy settings. There is a simple and fast campaign system. There are also three excellent supplements which although not required add much to the game from dungeoneering (Songs of Gold & Darkness), to overland adventures (Songs of Wind and Water) and more detailed campaigns (Songs of Deeds and Glory. The system is actively supported online with many supplements and campaign books under development. There are also two genre specific books available: Song of

Arthue & Merlin (for gaming King Arthur) and Song of the Splintered Lands.

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
