

I bought the Kindle version of this book expecting to use it during my walks in the woods, but it is useless for that. The illustrations are very small and many of the ones I viewed, particularly range maps, were useless even after zooming in on them. I also expected the book to have some sort of identification process to lead the reader to pertinent illustrations so the reader could differentiate what he is seeing in front of him from among candidate species in the book. No such luck. On the other hand, if the reader already knows what he's looking for, he can easily find it. I returned my copy for a refund.
